Classroom Grant	Amount	Description
Filmmakers for Tomorrow: FHS Digital Film and Broadcast Media FHS Joshua Howard, Cassandra Elam & Tyler Davison	\$1,000	With equipment funded through this grant, FHS students will engage in two creative projects. With FHS Films, student teams will design, develop, and direct their own original digital films. Their audiences may be FHS students, the community, or state, national, or world competitions. FHS News will consist of a variety of digital projects geared to tell the stories happening at FHS and in the community.
Piano Lab FHS Laurey Lehman	\$1,000	Students in the FHS Piano Lab course will build skills as overall musicians through both group instruction and individual lab time. The grant will fund three keyboards with headphones, which will expand the opportunities for differentiated instruction and student practice. (The course is limited to students who have not had extensive piano instruction.)
#GoUHornets FHS Lisa McDaniel	\$ 500	All freshmen will take one or more college or technical school visits. The purpose is to give them early exposure to campus life and admissions requirements.
Community Garden FHS Tyler Helton & Casie Farmer	\$ 500	Students enrolled in Environmental Science and Biology classes will build and assist in the upkeep of a community garden near the FHS greenhouse. Grant funds will provide materials, tools, and plants.
Building the Book Buddy Bridge Bartley Elementary Robyn Frame & Katie Finley	\$ 500	Each week, Bartley kindergarten students will fill their Book Buddy Bags with books on their reading level for at home reading practice which will reinforce and increase their reading fluency. The grant provides funds for leveled take-home classroom library books.
Examine, Explore, Expand: STEAM Outdoors FECC Shannon Forbis & Sandee Poss	\$1,000	Enhancements to the FECC outdoor classroom will allow students to understand science, work with new technology, and become mathematicians as they solve problems. Grant purchases include materials to build a table, 20 Adventure Explorer Kits, compost bin, weather station, and art supplies.
Seek, Calm, Learn FECC Kara Wilkerson	\$ 500	The grant will provide multiple items to allow early childhood special education students to Seek their sensory needs to Calm their bodies and then be ready to Learn. These tools will reduce distractions and maximize learning.
Crash Course in Physics Data Collection FMS Lucy Shrout	\$1,000	Data collection technology (motion detectors, force sensors, and a dynamics cart/track system) will give FMS students the opportunity to plan and conduct their own investigations in their 8 th grade physics curriculum and to analyze data in math class.

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8th Grade Cross-Curricular Dinner Theater Project FMS Bethany Moebes	\$1,000	The grant will provide materials to enhance this FMS project, which includes multiple departments and 8 th grade students in writing and fully staging an original musical theater piece.
The FMS Thrive Hive (3rd Year) FMS Heather Yates, Stephanie Horstmeier & Jo Williamson	\$ 500	The FMS PBIS store allows students to spend the dollars they have earned for positive behaviors on prizes. In the Thrive Hive, students can also purchase necessities to help take care of some of their immediate needs so they can focus on being successful students. The grant funds will supplement donated items to stock the shelves of the Thrive Hive.
Hornet Artist Club FMS Craig C. Chapman	\$ 500	The Hornet Artist Club will provide an after school club for creative minded students to be involved in art beyond the classroom. The grant will provide materials for their projects.
Teaching Social Skills Through Literature Bush Elementary Brandi Hassien, Kim Jones & Alexi Cavins	\$ 500	Third grade teachers at Bush will use mentor texts with a social skill theme as read aloud books in their classrooms. The stories will help students practice and talk through situations. Grant funds will be used to purchase the books.
Getting Social in the Community Bartley Elementary Jennifer Anthony & Kayla Garwood	\$ 500	Bartley classrooms will have additional nonfiction books which students will read and use to prepare reports that they will share during service learning trips to local nursing homes. Students will also display and share their work with their own families during a family night. Grant funds will purchase the books and student admission at the Auto World Museum.
Breakout Bonanza Bartley Elementary Jessica Wright	\$ 500	Fifth grade students will use Breakout EDU digital challenges to engage in academically-focused games across any subject area to solve a series of puzzles. They must use subject area content as well as critical thinking, collaboration, creativity, and communication.
