

Whitney Eastwood, Debra Hunter and Kylie Lane Students in the Piano Lab course will earn basic skills of playing piano. This grant will provide portable roll-up keyboards for students to check out to take home. It will allow students without at home pianos to continue building their skills through additional practice.

Students in three FHS science classes will earn about the biology of all living things. This project purchases equipment to expand genetic typing units in Biology and Genetics classes.

This project will provide student materials needed to fully implement the HighScope Curriculum providing high quality hands-on learning experiences in a small group setting. Funds will replenish supplies for a gardening project and purchase new materials to expand student learning.

This project provides an educational LEGO set, including lessons and activities, to promote 4<sup>th</sup> grade students' fundamental STEM understanding of simple and powered machines, structures and mechanisms.

The Fulton Early Childhood Center facility/staff will obtain materials, supplies, and resources to help prepare Pre-K students for their upcoming kindergarten experience. This project will focus on the social and emotional development of Pre-K students.

Students will create food-safe ceramic bowls in their FHS art classes. During the FHS Fine Arts Night, attendees may contribute \$10 for soup in their choice of these bowls. They may keep the bowl and the proceeds of the fundraiser will go to the local food bank.

Kindergarten students will take field trips throughout the school year in the local community or surrounding communities. The field trips will vary from learning experiences to service learning projects that focus on giving back to others.

Kinder Space

*Bush School* Whitney Eastwood, Debra Hunter and Kylie Lane This project will provide a Makerspace area in each kindergarten classroom. The area will incorporate engineering and crafting materials, STEM tasks, technology, robotics, and more. The hands-on experiences will be used for whole group, small group, and individual exploration.

I-Pads in the Classroom Continuation Grant (2nd Year) *McIntire School* Alison White, Michelle Moore Students will have the opportunity to bring more creativity across the curriculum, along with helping the teacher formatively assess their learning. Students will be able to integrate, problem solve, and use collaboration skills more effectively. 2 additional classroom I-pads/cases to be purchased.

Ed and Jean Avra Classroom History Grant: Exploring World War I Fulton High School Rose Bethell This cross-curricular experience will impact 65 sophomore students who are enrolled in World History Honors and English II Honors. Students will visit the World War I Museum and Memorial in Kansas City, MO. This field experience will help students better understand the impact of WWI on the course of history. Students will have the opportunity to interact with over 300,000 objects and documents promoting students' personal connections to history.

#### Ed and Jean Avra Classroom History Grant & Scholarship

The Ed and Jean Avra Classroom History Grant & Scholarship was established upon the death of Eva Jean Avra. Recipients of the scholarship are to be graduating seniors of Fulton High School who announce an intention to enter the teaching profession and plan to attend a Missouri 4-year institution of higher education. The first funds will be distributed this spring.

In addition to the scholarship, the Avra Trust funds an annual classroom History Grant at the Fulton High School.

#### The Blattner Family Scholarship

The Blattner family is funding a new scholarship to honor the contributions and services of the Blattner Family and specifically, of Howard Douglas Blattner, Sr. and Howard Douglas Blattner, Jr., to the school district through years of service to the Fulton Public Schools Board of Education and dedication to the Fulton Public Schools.

Judge Gene Hamilton, FHS '60, was inducted posthumously into the Alumni Hall of Fame at the Gala. In 1970 Judge Hamilton was appointed prosecutor by the Governor when he returned from serving in the Army. While serving as prosecutor he also was in private practice. He was elected in 1982 as 13th Judicial Circuit Judge. Throughout his career he was appointed by the MO Supreme Court to chair the Committee drafting Criminal Rules for the Court and recognized numerous times by the Missouri Bar and the Missouri Bar Association Foundation. Judge Hamilton retired in 2010. During his career he tried more than 500 cases.

The second Alumni Hall of Fame honoree was Bil Jackson. Even though Bil left Fulton High to attend Interlochen Arts Academy his senior year, the Class of 1977 claims him as one of their own. Bil has been acclaimed as one of the premier clarinetists of our time. He has long been featured as a soloist with numerous orchestras and chamber music festivals throughout the country. His career began with the Honolulu Symphony as principal clarinetist at age 19 and he was the only person to win the International Clarinet Competition twice. Bil recently retired as Associate Professor of Clarinet at the Blair School of Music at Vanderbilt University.

Carol Robertson was inducted into the Fulton Public Schools Foundation Educators Hall of Fame. Carol taught at the Fulton Public Schools for 30 years. At the high school she taught general and honors biology, chemistry, honors genetics and honors advanced biology. She was awarded Teacher of the Year for the Fulton 58 District and received the Outstanding Biology Teacher Award given by the National Association of Biology Teachers. Among the many awards and honors Carol has received, she received the highest award for science teachers in the country, the 2015 Presidential Award for Excellence in mathematics and Science Teaching (PAEMST) - the Missouri awardee for high school science.

Posthumously, Jack Garner was inducted in the Educator Hall of Fame. Mr. Garner was hired by the Fulton Public Schools at the beginning of the 1963 school year as the first full-time vocal music teacher. Jack started the Chamber Choir, known today as the Chamber Singers, in 1965. He taught music until the 1973-1974 school year. Upon his death, the Jack Garner Memorial Music Scholarship was formed in 1986 and the Foundation is pleased to serve as manager of these funds.

## **GALA 2021 continued**



Miss Marjorie Castle began teaching at West School in 1923. In 1932 she received her Bachelor of Science degree in Education and life certificate to teach in the elementary school. She continued to teach 3rd, 4th and 6th grades until 1962. In 1962, after having devoted half-time to the principal's work for 19 years, she was assigned to full time principal at West School and then at McIntire. Miss Castle devoted her life to the students she taught and retired in 1966 after teaching and serving as Principal for 43 years. We were honored to posthumously induct her into the Foundation's Educator Hall of Fame.

## **DISTRICT NEWS**

## From the Superintendent — Dr. Ty Crain

It has been challenging times over the past couple of years for everyone, but Fulton Public Schools continues to look to the future. Proposition S passed in the summer of 2020 and continues to take shape across the district. This past summer all three elementary schools were equipped with secure entrances to increase safety for staff and students. Plumbing and electrical upgrades were completed and the parking lots at Bush and McIntire were resurfaced and

improved. Over winter break, teams will begin to mobilize for the high school project scheduled for completion in May of 2023. This project will include upgrades in plumbing and electrical across the building, theater renovations with a new lobby, and a second gym with additional restrooms and administrative offices at the new entrance. Meanwhile, the design team is developing the plans for improvements at Fulton Middle School including a secure entrance, additional classrooms, plumbing, and electrical upgrades, along with a renovation of the pole barn. It is exciting to improve existing facilities while expanding for new and improved opportunities to better serve our students.

The Fulton Board of Education is working to finalize and adopt a new strategic plan. The plan will be utilized to guide the actions of administration and staff over the next five years with a focus on continuous improvement. As part of this work, the district has made a commitment to K-12 literacy with the adoption and alignment of core resources. Along with a significant financial commitment, teachers have been training throughout the school year to effectively implement new instructional strategies. We all know literacy is key to educational success.

Again, these are challenging times, but with the support of the community, families, and students, Fulton Public Schools continues to focus on tomorrow and success for all students. We are thankful for all of you that donate to the Fulton Public Schools Foundation. Your contributions benefit the teachers, the students and the District.
